#### **GENERAL POLICIES FOR ELEMENTARY PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION**

1) **PARISH REGISTRATION** - Parents of children attending our PSR process must be registered in St. Clare Parish. If you are not registered, you will be contacted to complete a parish census form. If you wish to have your children attend our PSR process and are registered at another parish, we must have a letter of permission from the pastor of the parish in which you are presently registered for your children to attend classes here.

2) **TUITION** - The tuition for each child enrolled in PSR is as follows:

- \$80 One Child
- \$125 Two Children
- \$150 Three Children or more children per family
- \$150 per child for those not active, registered, or participating members of St. Clare

**Payment is to be made at the time of online registration at**: <u>https://www.osvhub.com/st-clare-church/forms/psr-registration-form-24</u>. Payment is needed to pay for our book & supply bills. Every child is welcome into PSR. If the tuition payment poses a hardship for you and you are not able to pay within the first month or would like to make other arrangements, select Offline Payment at time of registration and contact Ms. Mascia 440-449-4242 Ext. 119 or <u>Imascia.stclare@att.net</u> or Brad Jasko at 440-449-4242 Ext. 122 or <u>bjasko.stclare@gmail.com</u>.

3) <u>MASS ATTENDANCE</u> - As a Catholic community we believe in teaching our children that the centrality of our faith lies in the celebration of the Sacraments, particularly the Eucharist. We teach the children that as Catholics we have the privilege and responsibility to attend Mass each week. **THIS IS NOT AN OPTION.** Parents who have children enrolled in our faith formation are expected to show their children by example of **faithfully attending Mass each week.** Because we feel so strongly about this, the parish staff consider it an utmost priority. We hope that if you choose to send your child to PSR, you are serious about your responsibility to take your children to Mass each week.

4) **PRAYERS** - Because of limited class time, it is not possible for us to teach the children their prayers by memorization, therefore we ask you as parents and the primary religious educators of your children, to gradually teach them basic prayers. A list of prayers that your child should know by the conclusion of the year can be found in their Catechism Handbook under Treasure of the Catholic Faith. In addition to memorizing a prayer, it is far more important that the child understands the meaning of the words they recite. As parents you are the primary catechist to share our faith with your children. Please take time each day to pray with your child to help them develop a prayerful attitude and regular prayer habits, such as morning prayers, grace at meals, bedtime prayers and blessings. This will teach them to look for and see God in the world around them.

#### FAITH FORMATION POLICIES & GUIDELINES

1) All families must acknowledge reading and their commitment to adherence of **PSR In Person Guidelines** regarding health and safety before attending In Person PSR. This document was emailed to parents upon registration and can be found on our parish website <u>https://saintclare.net/religious-</u> <u>education</u>.

2) <u>ATTENDANCE & ABSENCES</u> - It is extremely important that children attend PSR classes on a regular basis. <u>If your child will be absent, please email Imascia.stclare@att.net or</u> <u>bjasko.stclare@gmail.com with the child's name, grade or classroom teacher, and reason for</u> <u>absence</u>. If a child is absent for any reason, the missed lesson(s) can be made up online using Google Classroom platform. Each family/student will receive link to their Google Classroom. Students will be asked to complete the lesson for that week online and post an appropriate response to the topic posted for the missed week. We realize that there will be times when children are ill or there is a family conflict or special occasion, but by completing lessons online the students can continue their faith formation and remain a part of the community. If all work is kept up and completed, then the child will not need to repeat the year.

3) <u>CLASS TIME, DROP OFF & PICK UP</u> - Classes begin promptly at 9am on Saturdays and all children are expected to be in their classrooms by that time. Classes are concluded at 10:15am. For their safety, no child will be allowed to leave the building except with their parent/guardian or authorized adult. 4) **BOOKS & FOLDERS**- Each child receives their own folder, and each week will receive a Learner Leaflet with their lesson. These are to be used at home throughout the week and especially for Sunday's liturgy but folders **must be brought to each class**. **Please check their folder weekly for newsletters and notes**.

5) **PARENT CHILD FAITH FORMATION COVENANT**: Parents and children must read and commit to the Parent Child Faith Formation Covenant. This document was emailed to parents upon registration and can be found on our parish website <a href="https://saintclare.net/religious-education">https://saintclare.net/religious-education</a>.

6) **<u>DISCIPLINE</u>** - If a child is sent out of the classroom because of a discipline problem, the child will finish their lesson under office supervision, and you will be called to inform you of the nature of the discipline problem. We then ask the parents to talk to the child about the problem when returning home from class that morning. If a child is sent out of the classroom a second time during the year, the child again completes the lesson in the office but this time when the parents are called, they are asked to come to the school after class to talk to the child's teacher.

7) **<u>REPORT CARDS</u>**-Simple evaluation records are sent home with the children two times a year **January 11<sup>th</sup> and May 10<sup>th</sup>.** This is not meant to be an evaluation of a child's faith, but merely a tool to find out a child's basic understanding of the doctrines taught in the classroom. **The report cards will be emailed to parents to review.** 

8) <u>LITURGIES</u> - We are tentatively scheduled to celebrate Mass together October 26 and February 1 to show our children the importance of community prayer and encountering Jesus in the Liturgy of the Word and Eucharist. Parents, families & friends are welcome to join us at 9am in the church on these dates.

9) VISITATION - Anyone wishing to visit a classroom can do so only by coming to the office in Room 22 and receiving permission from the Director of Faith Formation and Religious Education. We need to be aware at all times of people who are in the building for safety of the children.

10) ALL cell phones, hats & sport shoes with cleats and/or mud are to be off in the building.

#### DIOCESAN POLICY FOR SUSPECTED CHILD ABUSE

If you know, believe or have a reasonable cause to suspect that a child under eighteen years of age or a mentally retarded, developmentally disabled, or a physically impaired child under twenty-one years of age has suffered or faces a threat of suffering any physical or mental wound injury, disability, or condition of a nature that reasonably indicates abuse (Examples include, but are not limited to, physical abuse, sexual abuse, and emotional abuse) or neglect of the child you SHALL immediately report that knowledge or reasonable cause to suspect to:

You SHALL also: Immediately notify your parish catechetical leader, principal or program coordinator that a report has been made, or jointly make that call together. That person (the one you notified) must then report the same to the Bishop's Office.
